6.4 Emergency Response Questionnaire

Pam Bolt TCDC has agreed to print the questionnaires but requires a number. We agreed 500: # rateable properties, + extras. Carolyn will ask RD delivery how many mailboxes. A heads-up will appear in the NL, with a link to the online version. Hard copies will be available at Nina's Shop, be distributed at the Public Meeting, and will be delivered by hand to mailboxes after the Public Meeting. Carolyn will follow up on distribution method: the Fire Brigade could distribute them in November along with their phone books; the RD guy could be persuaded to drop them; Carolyn could hand-deliver.

6.5 Dark Skies update

Alastair is attending the International Dark Skies Conference in Tekapo next week and will report back on options for achieving some kind of designation (we should aim for the highest). Otama and Opito are keen - no streetlights there yet; Whitianga, Matarangi, and the KT Motor Camp all have issues that need resolving (but can be resolved).

6.6 Tsunami Warnings

Alastair recently attended a geological talk and reports that the current Public Education Message of "long, strong- get gone" is not accurate (or safe), as tsunami-generating quakes may not be felt equally strongly in all areas. All quakes should be treated as potential tsunami risks. This message should be included in the Public Meeting discussion on emergency response.

6.7 kuaotunu.nz website

Kathy ran us through the progress that has been made on the new website.

- most things can be accessed from the home page big buttons with pictures
- the Community Plan will have an accordion structure main points visible only; they can be clicked for more info to appear
- the KRRA community group segment needs a graphic; a picture of minutes being taken can be a gap-filler until a suitable logo can be produced (Viv's old letterhead is not digitally suitable)
- there is a section for "meet-the-locals" profiles; Courteny Linnecar assisting with its development. Keep the questions consistent and the answers brief! Have three at a time on the main page and a link to previous profiles (rotate 3 at a time).
- business-directory entries will cost \$50 for businesses within the KT area and \$100 outside
- the website will go live in early December and any sections not yet ready will not be included. It will never be "finished" as a whole, but will continually evolve.

7 Any other business:

The bridge is open! Although convenience will be regained,, many locals will miss the daily footbridge-crossing neighbourly chats, the quiet roads, and the almost-empty boat ramp! - Perhaps a matter for discussion at the public meeting: a sticker for KT R&R boat ramp users, and a levy for everyone else.
