Another Busy Year Reports Reserve Management Group

Under the new "lean and mean" group we now only have six members. However the "new" committee continues to represent all parts of Kuaotunu and Rings Beach. Alan Hill has been elected as chair, with Mary Patullo continuing as secretary. Other committee members are Julie Heraud, Craig Lidgard, Patricia Olsen and Vivienne McLean. Thanks to Cliff Heraud, Piet Kee, Harvey Collings, Warwick Lidgard and Kath Simpson for their input in recent years.

Work completed in 1998-99 include three new picnic tables. Sand ladders have been repaired at Rings Beach and opposite Jacksons' Motor Camp. A new ladder has also been installed east of the camp, to cater for the increasing numbers using the beach. The steps washed out at Kuaotunu West have been rebuilt. Reserve Management Group members have again carried out extensive dune, reserve and estuary plantings with plants provided from our annual budget and by Environment Waikato. Releasing and fertilising of previously planted trees continues.

The old wire barrier fence at the soccer field reserve has been removed and a new bollard-style barrier installed to channel car access. Planting has been undertaken along the dune edge of the reserve and further planting of pohutukawa is planned.

Preliminary work on stage two of the Black Jack Track has been completed, with track formation and steps to be carried out as funding becomes available. The existing track is proving increasingly popular and provides excellent views of Kuaotunu Beach and across to the main Coromandel range.

A pleasant picnic area has been created above the rocky beach at Kuaotunu West, with a large grassy clearing, picnic table and seating. Over eighty trees have been planted up the steeper slopes and on the banks.

A ceremony was held at dawn on the Sunday of Queens Birthday Weekend on the Maori Reserve. A commemorative plaque was unveiled by the descendants of the chief Ruihana Kawhero who was buried close to this site in the late 1800's. A puriri tree was also planted.

1999/2000 Activities

Group members are currently preparing work plans and budgets for the new financial year. These will be finalised at our next meeting in the first week of September. Kauri 2000: Kuaotunu Initiative Gets National Reaction

The recent launch of Kauri 2000 was an emotional occasion for Cliff Heraud and fellow Trustees as months of planning finally started coming to fruition.

Twenty young kauri were planted at the Department of Conservation Visitor Centre in the Kauaeranga Valley to mark the occasion, with the first tree being planted by Patron Dame Catherine Tizard

KAURI 2000

Kauri 2000 is a charitable trust set up to mark the new millennium by starting a long term programme to replant the once great kauri forests of the Coromandel. DOC has made 294 hectares of land available on 22 sites around the Peninsula and the project is being supported by Environment Waikato and Thames-Coromandel District Council.

"We've been staggered by the response from all over New Zealand," says Cliff. In just 10 days following coverage on TVNZ News, nearly 300 letters were received from people from Invercargill to Keri Keri, enclosing donations of more than \$5000.

A major promotional campaign starts in October and the Kauri 2000 logo, designed by Warren Howie of Kuaotunu, will soon become a familiar sight!


Use it or Lose it!

Fire Brigade News

Just a reminder that permits are still required for all open fires ... contact the Mercury Bay Service Centre if you need more information. Talk to Graeme Bainbridge at the Kuaotunu Rural Fire Force if your fire could be sizeable or you're unsure how to manage it, so any obvious problems can be identified. The guys would rather help out than get called out!

Graeme says the volunteers have been busy this year with motor vehicle accident training and also more rural fire training.

"We've had plenty of help and plenty of training this year ... it's been excellent," he says. The brigade now has a standby generator ready for the Year 2000 as well as new radios and fluoro green helmets. Funding is still a big issue though — just taking the fire tender over the hill costs \$60 in petrol!! The Brigade gets an annual grant from the Waikato Community Trust and hopes to apply for Fire Service funding, but they really rely on that Christmas raffle.
